

Do you need to give a solicitation statement?

1A: Are you a paid employee, trustee, officer of a charity?

No

Yes

1B: Are you carrying out a door-to-door or street collection?

No

You do not need to give a solicitation statement

Yes

1C: Are you being paid more than £10 a day or £1,000 a year?

No

You do not need to give a solicitation statement

Yes

You must give a solicitation statement which states the name of the charity you are fundraising for and the fact that you are being paid as an employee, trustee or officer of the charity to fundraise for them

2A: Are you being paid by a charity to fundraise on their behalf?

No

Yes

2B: Are you being paid more than £10 a day or £1,000 a year?

No

You do not need to give a solicitation statement

You may be a professional fundraiser
Professional fundraisers must give a solicitation statement which states the name of the charity they are fundraising for, how much they will be paid (estimated if necessary), and how their payment will be calculated
Employees of a professional fundraiser should provide a statement about the payment their employer will receive

3A: Are you a volunteer fundraiser?

3B: Are you having expenses of over £1,000 covered?

You do not need to give a solicitation statement

You may be a professional fundraiser

4A: Are you selling something and giving some of the proceeds to a charity?

You may be a commercial participator
Commercial participators must give a solicitation statement which states the name of the charity you are fundraising for, how much the charity will receive (estimated if necessary), and how this payment will be calculated
